The International Society for Language Studies (ISLS) peer-reviewed book series *Readings in Language Studies* publishes writings featuring a range of stylistic (essay, oral history, artistic-expressive, and technical) and research approaches to language studies. The series includes singularly-topical and general volumes. Drawing from open calls for contributions and ISLS conference proceedings, the volume series is useful to a wide variety of scholarly disciplines, classroom and research contexts, and international fora.

The intent of **Volume 2** is to feature international contributions representing state-of-the-field reviews, multi-disciplinary perspectives, theory-driven syntheses of current scholarship, reports of new empirical research, and critical discussions of major topics centered on language and power. Consistent with the mission of ISLS, Volume 2 seeks to “bridge these arbitrary disciplinary territories and provide a forum for both theoretical and empirical research, from existing and emergent research methodologies, for exploring the relationships among language, power, discourses, and social practices.” All submitted manuscripts are peer- and editor-reviewed.

SUBMISSION OF CHAPTER MANUSCRIPTS

A chapter submission must consist of **one** document in MSWord with the following parts:

1. Cover page with title and author(s) institutional affiliation and e-mail, phone, fax, and address.
2. A 100-word abstract of the chapter, targeted strand, and at least three keywords.
3. A complete chapter manuscript consisting of no more than 6,000 words (or 25 pages typed double space in Times New Roman font pt 12).
4. The chapter manuscript must follow formatting guidelines of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA 5th edition).
5. All tables and figures must be formatted to a single page, grayscale or black and white, portrait orientation and adhere to APA style guidelines.
6. Any image used in the manuscript must be accompanied with a statement of permission indicating the source; It is the author’s responsibility to seek and provide ISLS written documentation of permission for image use in the chapter.
